Unless there is a shortage of applications in the above categories, we are unlikely to support:

- Other Charitable Organizations that in themselves give money to Charity
- Start-up initiatives

SPECIAL RULES applying to LIGHT HORSES and SPORTS CLASSES.

1. The district comprises of the parishes of Chagford, Drewsteignton, Gidleigh, Manaton, Spreyton, Cheriton Bishop, Lustleigh, Moretonhampstead, North Bovey, Throwleigh, South Tawton and an area within half a mile of the Bridge at Postbridge.
2. Any protest must be made to the Secretary at once with a deposit of £50, to be returned only if case protest is upheld.
3. All horses and ponies to be bona-fide property at the time of entry.
4. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current safety Standards **MUST** be worn by all riders under 17 & by all riders when jumping in the Ring, the practice or collecting ring PAS 015 (2011), VG01.040 2014-12 or BS EN1384:2023, all with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC Mark.
5. The Committee will not be responsible for accidents.
6. All dogs to be always kept on non- retractable leads.
7. All Native Ponies to be registered with their respective stud books.
8. Handlers/Riders must always be in control of their animals to the best of their ability.
9. Riders entered in any Lead Rein Classes must be a minimum of 3 years of age by the current show date.
10. **The Organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards**

Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.

To enter a stallion in any class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPSBS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPSBS Voluntary Veterinary Examination.

Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a stallion bridle disc which are available to purchase from the SPSBS.

There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes.

Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted and take no further part.

Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

Tattersalls RoR OPEN In-Hand Show Series Qualifier 2026

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 2026

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1 st January 2025. Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 2026

GENERAL RULES OF THE SOCIETY

Applicable to all Classes and Sections unless otherwise stated.

1. The Committee reserves the right to withhold any prize, or prizes should they consider the exhibit to be of insufficient merit or prize winners fail to parade as requested, also the right to withdraw or delete any classes in the Schedule for any reason or circumstances they may arise, or in the event of there being one entry only. Such deletion may be put into effect by the Secretary.
2. The decision of all the Referees in all cases of dispute is final and exhibitors enter on this understanding.
3. Any entry may be refused should it be considered the exhibitor or exhibitors are not eligible to compete in a class or classes or resident in the district.
4. All Horses, Sheep and Cattle must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor, **at the time of entry.**
5. In the event of any dispute or protest, all such protests must be handed to the Secretary in writing immediately the dispute occurs, together with a deposit of £50 to be returned only if the protest is upheld and, in any case, not later than 4p.m. on the day of the Show.
6. In the event of a tie for any Special Prize awarded on points, such prize will be given to the exhibitor having made the largest number of entries.
7. The Committee accepts no responsibility for any loss or accident that may occur to either exhibitors, spectators or members of the general public at the Show, and entries are accepted on this condition.
8. No exhibits will be allowed to leave the Showground before 4p.m. unless a written permit is given by the Secretary.
9. All entries accompanied by the appropriate fees must be sent to the Secretary by Monday 21st July 2025. No entries will be accepted unless accompanied by the appropriate fee and no entries will be accepted on the field nor will substitutions or alterations to the printed catalogue be allowed.
10. No entries whatsoever will be accepted after the closing date except where otherwise stated. This rule will be strictly adhered to.
11. Riders entered in Leading Rein Classes must be 3 years of age by the current show date.
12. Sheep Section only – 2 entries per class per exhibitor.
13. The Chief Stewards decision to accept or reject entries is final.
