### Rules

- 1. Competitors must complete the Entry Form contained in this Schedule and forward it in an envelope, together with the appropriate entrance fee to: Laura Reed, Cedar Cottage, Liverton, TQ12 6HS or CHS, c/o Jaded Palates, 42 The Square, Chagford, TQ12 8AH before 4:30pm on Monday 18th of August 2025.
- 2. An exhibitor shall be allowed no more than TWO entries in any one class.
- 3. Young persons should stage their exhibits themselves in the tent without assistance. This applies to all classes in the Youth Section. They are also requested to state their age on their Entry Form.
- 4. Entrance fees for each entry in all open classes will be 50p Youth Classes 30p. A single exhibitor making entries totalling more than £7.50 will be sent one free entrance ticket to the show. (Please include a SAE and allow time for posting).
  Late entries after 4:30pm on 18th August are charged at £1 each.
- 5. The exhibitor will be supplied with a numbered card which must be affixed to each exhibit by the exhibitor. Exhibitors should collect these cards at the show tent when staging their exhibits.
- 6. All exhibits in the Vegetables & Produce and Flowers classes must be the property of and have been cultivated by, the exhibitor for at least three months, except where otherwise stated. The committee reserve the right to visit the gardens of all intended exhibitors.
- 7. Exhibits may be staged from 4:00pm to 6:30pm on Wednesday 20th August and from 7:00am to 8:30am on Thursday 21st August. Only stewards and exhibitors will be allowed in the tent before 8:30am on the 21st of August at which time the tent will be cleared for judging. Stewards on duty will remain during the judging which will commence at 9:00am.
- 8. The horticultural tent will be opened to the public on completion of the judging. It is hoped that this will be approximately 11:00am.
- 9. **NO** Green Oasis is to be used in **ANY** class. Recyclable alternatives are acceptable.

### Rules

- 10. Horticultural judging will be conducted under the RHS rules. The decision of the judges will be final and they have the power to withhold any prize if the exhibits are not in their opinion of sufficient merit to warrant an award. An RHS show handbook is available at the desk.
- 11. When collecting prize money, please tell the office your **Entrant Number** and the **Class Number**.
- 12. ON SHOW DAY No vehicles are allowed into the show ground until 5:30pm. Exhibits may not be removed from the tent before 5:00 pm, but must be collected by 6:00pm, on show day. Items left after 6pm will be disposed of at the discretion of the committee.
- 13. Points awarded as follows:

### **Individual Exhibits:**

1st prize - 5 points - 2nd prize 3 points - 3rd prize 1 point.

### Classes 27 to 30:

1st prize 10 points - 2nd prize 6 points - 3rd prize 2 points.

- 14. The committee accepts no responsibility for any loss or accident that may occur to exhibitors, their exhibits or members of the general public at the show and all entries are accepted on these conditions.
- 15. Please use the **GREEN H** sticker (only available enclosed in the hard copy schedules) if you need to deliver your exhibit by vehicle on show day between 7:00am and 8:30am **ONLY**, and then remove your vehicle immediately. The H sticker does not permit the vehicle or its occupants to remain on the show ground. If staying for the day you will have to purchase a wristband on entry. Only people wearing a wristband or official badge should be on the show ground after 8:30am.

ENTRIES CLOSE at exactly 4:30 PM on MONDAY the 18<sup>th</sup> August 2025. Late entries are accepted at £1 per entry.






